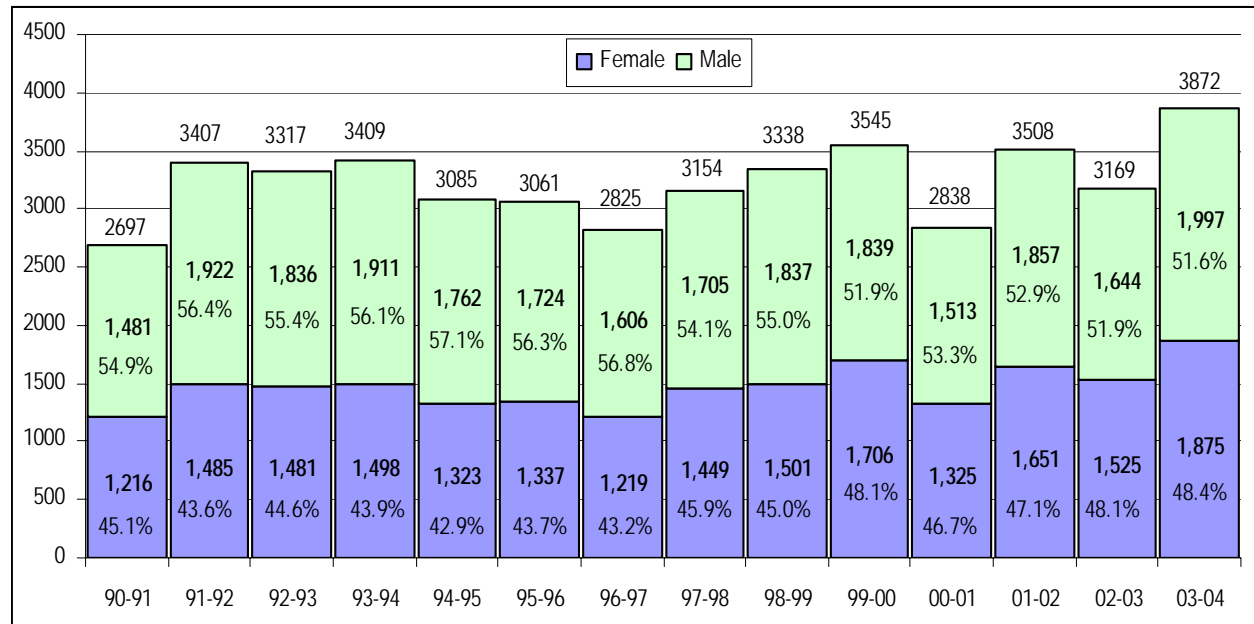

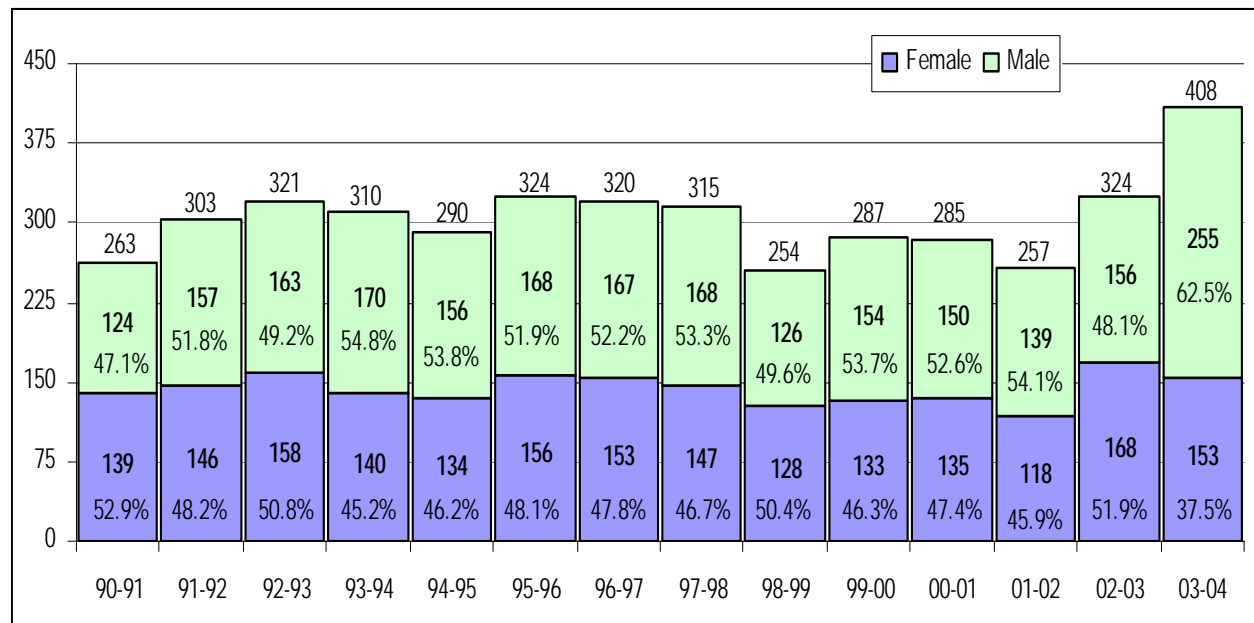

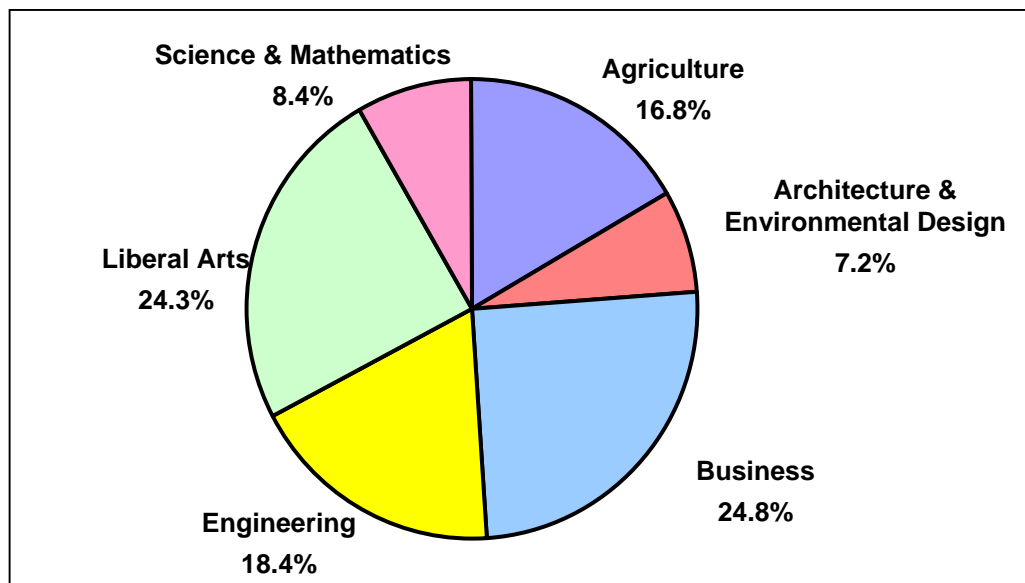

**First-time, Full-time Freshman Cohort**

This cohort of students is defined as first-time freshman students entering Cal Poly during the summer or fall quarter and enrolled in 12 or more units during the student's first fall quarter at Cal Poly. The percent graduated in 6 years includes degrees awarded in 4 and 5 year degree programs. The six year graduation rate reflects graduation through the sixth year including summer.
