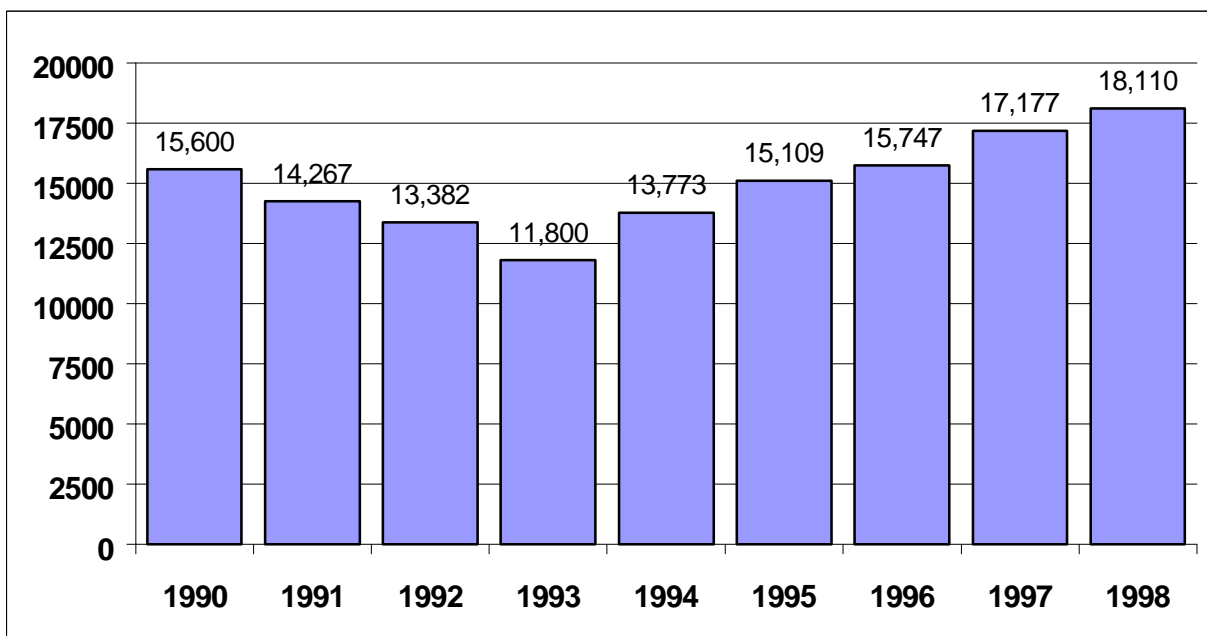


Undergraduate Admissions

Undergraduate applications numbered 18,110 for Fall 1998, the most applications processed in the past eleven years, and an increase of 933 applications over Fall 1997; 6,544 new undergraduate applicants were selected and 3,058 enrolled. First time freshmen applying for admission numbered 14,157 or 78.1% of the total undergraduate applicant pool, and represented 75.4% of the new students who enrolled.

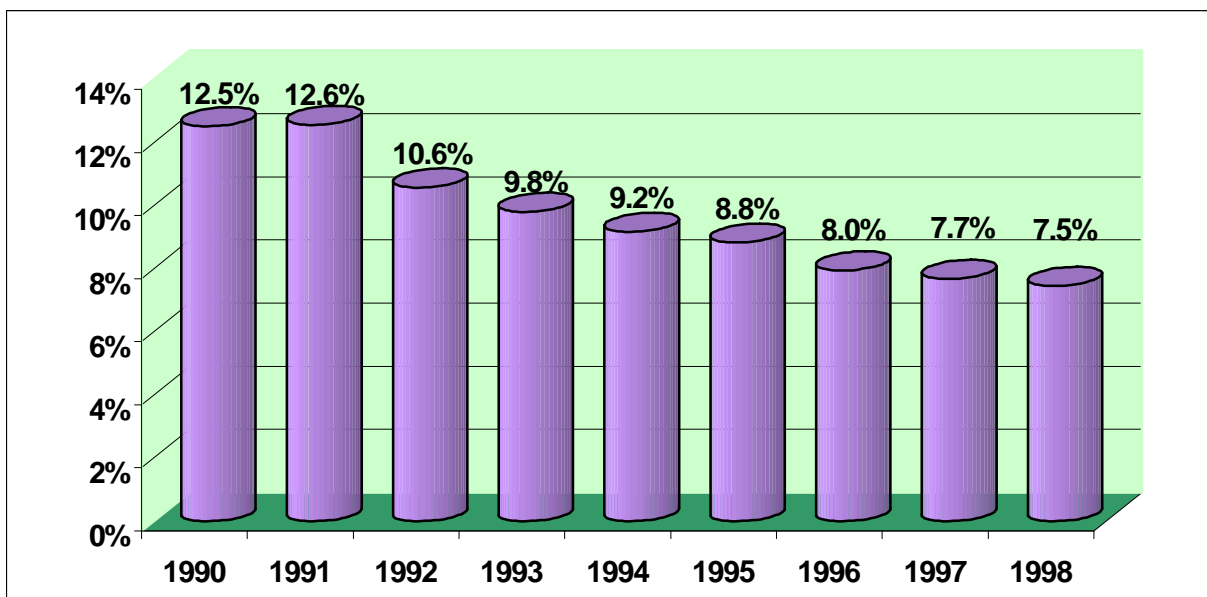

Undergraduate Enrollment by Full and Part-time Status

The percentage of undergraduate students classified as part-time (enrolled in eleven units or fewer in any quarter) continued to decline in the Fall of 1998. Over the eight year period from Fall 1990 to Fall 1998, the percentage of part-time students dropped from 12.5% to 7.5%. In the same period of time, the average number of units taken by undergraduate students has increased from 13.43 to 14.13.

Undergraduate Enrollment by Age

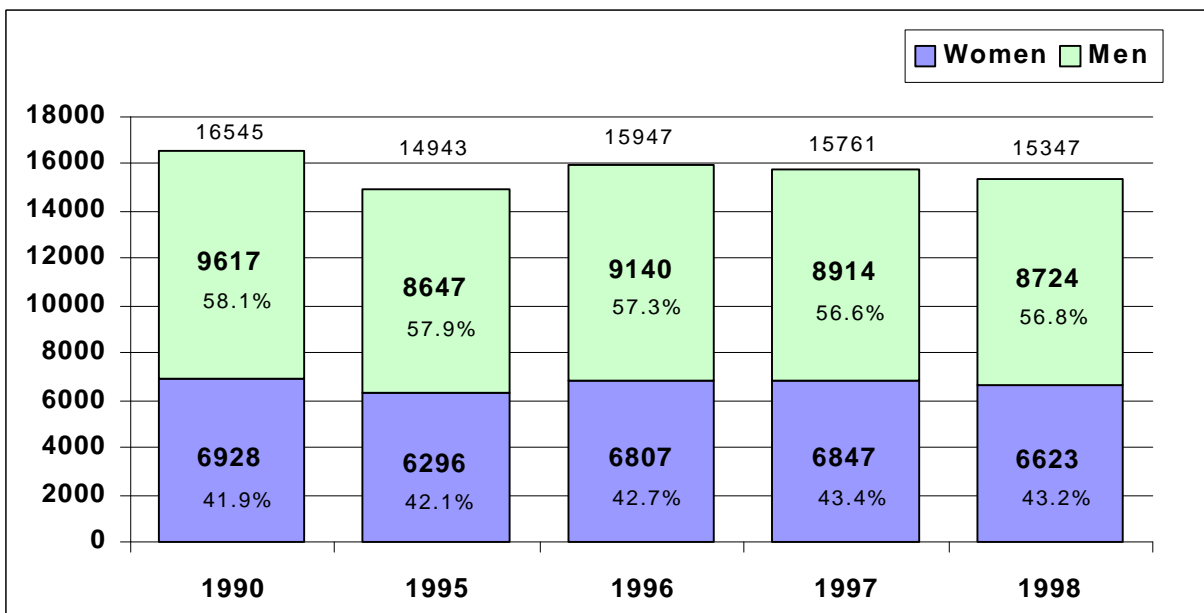
The average age of a Cal Poly undergraduate in Fall 1998 was 21.9 years compared to approximately 24.5 years for the CSU* as a whole. Cal Poly also has a large group of "traditional age" undergraduate students (21 years or younger) with 59.6% of the total enrolled undergraduates in that group.

Undergraduate Enrollment by Gender

There were 6,623 (43.2%) undergraduate women and 8,725 (56.8%) undergraduate men at Cal Poly in Fall 1998. From Fall of 1990 to Fall of 1994, the percentage of women undergraduates was approximately 41%. In 1995 and 1996, the percentage was approximately 42%.



Undergraduate Enrollment by Ethnic Origin

The Fall 1998 Cal Poly undergraduate student population continued to reflect the changing demographics of California. In Fall 1998 the non-white undergraduate student population was 38.1%, compared to 26.6% in Fall 1990.
