COVID-19 Vaccine, Pfizer Boosters and Flu Vaccine Offered on Campus This Month

Rite Aid is returning to campus to administer COVID-19 and flu vaccines in the Main Gym Lobby of the Cal Poly Recreation Center (No. 43, Room 101). The clinic will run from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 19, Friday, Oct. 22, Monday, Oct. 25, and Friday, Oct. 29. Flu shots are open to the entire campus community, including students, staff and faculty. The COVID-19 vaccine is only available to Cal Poly employees. (Students needing a COVID-19 vaccine should make an appointment at Campus Health and Wellbeing.) The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines will be available. Rite Aid will also offer Pfizer booster shots to individuals who have received the original two-dose series of Pfizer's COVID-19 vaccine and completed their primary series at least six months ago. That includes individuals 65 and older, those 18 through 64 with underlying medical conditions, and those over 18 who are at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission due to their occupational or institutional setting. Safer to Offer Workshops on Supporting Survivors of Gender- and Power-Based Violence
