Cal Poly Decreases Recycling Contamination with Help from CalRecycle Grant

Cal Poly has decreased recycling contamination on campus by 15%, thanks to CalRecycle state grant funds totaling \$225,000. The CalRecycle grant, awarded in late 2019, provided the funds to improve beverage container recycling as part of the university's zero-waste goals. These funds helped the campus decrease recycling contamination from 37% in 2019 to 22% in 2021. "We are very excited to see the needle move in a positive direction to reduce waste on campus," said Anastasia Nicole, CalRecycle grant lead and Cal Poly's zero waste coordinator for Facilities Management and Development. Contamination in recycle bins is a considerable obstacle to a successful recycling program; if recycling is not placed in the correct bins, it winds up in a landfill, Nicole said. "It was a lot of hard work," said Chloe Peng, a student assistant spearheading the marketing efforts. "But it was all worth it knowing I was making a difference. It was definitely time well spent." 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Faculty and Staff Should Upload Their Booster Record

Employees can now upload proof of their COVID-19 booster in compliance with the updated CSU COVID-19 Vaccine Policy, which requires a booster six months after the final dose of the original vaccination. Individuals are eligible for a booster five months after completing the Pfizer or Moderna primary vaccination series, or two months after receiving Johnson & Johnson. Cal Poly requires proof of vaccination, in compliance with the CSU policy and the respective bargaining unit MOUs. Acceptable proof of vaccination includes: a COVID-19 vaccination card, Digital COVID-19 Vaccine Record (https://myvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov/) or documentation from your medical provider. To upload your proof of vaccination and booster, go to the COVID-19 Info tab on the Cal Poly portal. The deadline for employees to update their booster information varies by bargaining unit and can be found at https://coronavirus.calpoly.edu/covid-19-vaccine. Employees who are not in compliance with the vaccination and booster mandate by the dates indicated will be required to submit to COVID-19 surveillance testing. Need a booster? Rite Aid returns to campus Friday, April 1, to administer COVID-19 vaccine and boosters in the Recreation Center (Room 109) from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.
