Last Works of Rachmaninoff, Strauss and Tchaikovsky on June 7

The Cal Poly Symphony conducted by David Arrivée will perform the final compositions of Sergei Rachmaninoff, Richard Strauss and Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, June 7, in the Performing Arts Center. It will perform the first movement from Rachmaninoff's "Symphonic Dances," completed three years before he died. Amy Goymerac will be featured on Strauss' "Im Abendrot" ("At Sunset"), the last of his "Four Last Songs" which he did not live to see premiered. Tchaikovsky conducted the premiere of his Symphony No. 6 in B Minor just nine days before he died.
