Student-Built Payload Hitches a Ride on a Space Plane

In June, a payload built by Cal Poly students took a historic ride on Dawn Aerospace's Aurora spaceplane. The flight from Tāwhaki National Aerospace Centre near Christchurch, New Zealand, carried the company's first U.S. student-built experiment to an altitude of 37,000 feet and speeds of Mach 0.79. "This mission is putting student-built hardware on the front lines of aerospace innovation," said Kurt Colvin, retired professor and payload advisor. Students designed the payload to test whether an off-the-shelf data acquisition system could withstand the rigors of high-altitude, spaceflight-like environments with similar performance to a custom system.

Interdisciplinary Student Teams Place Second and Third in Packaging Design Challenge

Two interdisciplinary teams, including graphic design, packaging design and business administration students from the College of Liberal Arts and Orfalea College of Business, placed second and third in the Paperboard Packaging Alliance 2025 Student Design Challenge. The annual competition challenges university students in leading sustainable packaging or graphic design programs from across North America to create innovative, recyclable paper-based packaging solutions that meet real-world customer needs. Team "PAWSH" and team "Teef Story" designed sustainable, recyclable packaging for a line of pet care products, PPA Pets.
