Mark Applebaum to Present 'Composing the Unexpected' Concert on Feb. 12

Guest artist Mark Applebaum will give a concert titled "Composing the Unexpected" at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 12 in Room 218 of the Davidson Music Center. A composer, improviser and instrument builder, he will present recent work spanning graphic scores, invented instruments and experimental compositions that blur the line between sound, visual art and theater. He's had notable commissions from the Merce Cunningham Dance Company, the Fromm Foundation, the Spoleto Festival, the Kronos Quartet, Chamber Music America, Ensemble Talea and the Vienna Modern Festival. He is the Edith and Leland Smith Professor of Composition at Stanford University.
