Campus Marks Construction Milestones with Two Topping Out Ceremonies

Cal Poly's Accelerated Master Plan marked milestones with topping out ceremonies at the Student Success Center on April 3 and a student housing facility on April 14. The housing facility is scheduled to open in fall 2026 and the Student Success Center in fall 2027. The topping out ceremony marks completion of structural framing, with a final beam raised and topped with an evergreen tree.
