### Researchers Help Install Third Rattlesnake Research Cam in Pennsylvania

A new platform has arrived to observe timber rattlesnakes in nature from the comfort of home thanks to a partnership between Cal Poly and Dickinson College in Pennsylvania. Project RattleCam recently launched its third livestream installation at an undisclosed, remote location in Pennsylvania on May 18. The new channel, now live through early fall, operates 24/7, with night-vision cameras capable of capturing the activities of snakes and other creatures that enter the frame of the camera after dark, such as rodents and weasels. The community science project can be accessed free on YouTube as part of Project RattleCam.

### **BEACoN Undergraduate Research Symposium is June 10**

The annual BEACoN Research Symposium is happening June 10 from noon to 2 p.m. in the Multi-Activity Center (Bldg. 43). BEACoN — which stands for Believe, Educate and Empower, Advocate, Collaborate, Nurture — is an undergraduate research mentorship program that provides underrepresented students with funded research opportunities under the support of a faculty mentor.
