\$1 Million Awarded to Charles and Claire Jacobson Animal Health Center

The Joseph W. Tripiano Charitable Fund, a fund of the Community Foundation for San Benito County, awarded a \$1 million grant to Cal Poly's Charles and Claire Jacobson Animal Health Center, providing transformational support for student learning and animal care. The funding will enhance hands-on learning by enhancing student learning opportunities in classroom, lab and clinical settings that will be used daily by students in the College of Agriculture, Food and Environmental Sciences' new Animal Health Center. Students will have access to advanced diagnostic equipment and will be able to perform forensic examinations on large animals using new hydraulic tables.
